CLASS DOJO COMMMUNICATION

We are thrilled that our communication mechanisms seem to be meeting the vast majority of parent's needs (we appreciate some think that the newsletter it too long which is why we have split it up into sections including 'what you need to know' so that you can read what is necessary and leave the rest.

We also realise that some parents prefer to communicate on the Dojo App instead of e-mails. This means that many messages for the office are going to teachers and senior leaders. So, in order to refine how this works we have set up an office contact on each Dojo so that any office / admin items can be directed to them save teaching staff and senior leaders copying and pasting messages to the office or chasing answers. We hope this is a refinement which will be useful both for parents and school staff. You can still use email and this is still the preferred approach for office staff.

WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY


Tomorrow is World Mental Health Day: 10th of October. #mentalhealth
