RELATIONSHIPS AND SEX EDUCATION

We have reviewed our relationships Education policy and curriculum which includes a review of Sex education in our schools. This has been conducted with the Trust and all Trust primary schools have the same approach. Conception has been taken out of the primary curriculum of our trust schools. Our jigsaw curriculum builds on relationships and changes but does not specifically teach about intercourse.

MATHS WORKBOOKS

We have noticed that some parents are purchasing workbooks for maths in order to practice key skills with their children at home. If any parent wishes to do this we would recommend the White Rose workbooks which can be found here <u>https://whiterosemaths.com/parent-workbooks/</u>

These books follow as closely as possible the teaching for mastery approach which we use in school and will have pictures and models that your child will be used to. This is of course optional. POPPIES

After half term each class will have a their own 'Poppy Shop', where children will be able to purchase a poppy (traditional of pin badges) or other merchandise—suggested donations start from 50 pence for zip pulls and reflectors, £1.00 for wristbands and £1.50 for snap bands.





SPEED AWARNESS

We have been asked to put a few words on the newsletter to highlight some of the speed that vehicles have been doing through the village. Can we remind anyone driving to school to please be aware of the speed limits within the community – if we all do our bit we can work together to help keep everyone safe. We have Preceed some information form Newborough News (an email newsletter which is sent regularly to the community) for your in-

formation:

Two volunteers did a Speedwatch session standing on the grass verge just north of Mill Meadow on Hollybush Road – with the speed detecting device supplied and calibrated by Staffordshire Police. They recorded 60 vehicles <u>between 8.30 and 9.30</u> of which 18 were recorded as driving at over 35mph, in the 30mph zone. There was a big increase in vehicles just before 9, and they clocked 3 vehicles doing 40mph (The number plates and vehicle details will be sent to the police who will send them a letter.). None of the vehicles slowed down

If you are familiar with Hollybush Road, you'll realise that there are no pavements along Hollybush Road from Mill Meadow until you get right down to the playpark, so pedestrians have no alternative other than to walk in the road.

We have attached a copy of the new school lunch for your attention—we will be on week 3 when we return on the 2nd November 2020. Children will just need to order their lunch with their class teacher during morning register (no need to pre-book) - don't forget children in Reception, year 1 and year 2 automatically get free school meals. For anyone in year 3 or above they are priced at £2.34 payable on ParentPay.

To coincide with All Saints and All Souls Days (1 & 2 November), beams of light will be cast into the night sky in an installation called 'Light of Hope'. All Saints Day, November 1, celebrates all the saints of God who have been beacons of Christ's light through the ages - people who have warmed and lit the world with their faith and love.
