

PARKING IN NEWBOROUGH

STAFFORDSHIRE The below text is from Staffordshire Police that we have been asked to share with our parents—please do take **POLICE** time to read and help us make our community safe for all :

Staffordshire Police has been made aware of a number of complaints relating to careless and inconsiderate parking that has been taking place in the Village of Newborough.

The issues seem to occur around school drop off and pick up time and are taking place in Elton Close, Chapel Lane, Yoxall Road and Duffield Lane. Whilst we appreciate the unprecedented times with the current COVID-19 situation we would like to remind all persons using this area to ensure that they park responsibly.

Parking responsibly includes not parking opposite or within 10 metres of a junction, not parking in such a position that it causes a danger or obstruction for other road users (this includes pedestrians) and ensuring that when you park you allow sufficient access for Emergency Service Vehicles and do not contravene any other Limited or No Waiting Order in place.

Road Safety is in the interest of everyone and whilst we seek to engage and encourage cooperation from those drivers using the area, if we continue to receive complaints then will seek to enforce any powers that exist which may include the issuing of fines or the prosecution of any person found committing an offence.


