## FRIDAY 18TH DECEMBER & COVID PLANS





You may have heard in the media that the Government has advised schools that, if they choose, they can have an INSET day on 18th December but then extend the term in January to make up for it. We have decided that one day is unlikely to make any difference to the risk of COVID.

We are responsible to contact trace until 24th December (6 days after closure) and so, whilst the local authority team would ensure we have the information we need if, your child tests positive for Covid after we have broken up, until

24th December, please also let me know via email on <u>asr\_headteacher@asr.jtmat.co.uk</u>

Finally, we will inform bubbles if we are notified there has been a COVID positive child or member remember of staff.

I, as contact tracer, will do this both via email and dojo and ask that you reply to say that you have received it and, will isolate. I then only have to telephone those who do not reply. I hope that makes sense!
