


Keep your pictures coming in, we will keep taking them in school and we will continue to connect!

WRAP AROUND CARE / BREAKFAST / AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

We are running this for both schools.

Both will run from 8.00 am until the start of school and from the end of school until 5.00 pm.

Needwood

We ask that you give us as much notice as possible and use this provision if you need and can do so as sadly, we are running at a loss but have decided to continue as it is a service you need to support your important work.

Rangemore

Support staff have kindly agreed to come early and stay later in order to run provision for our key worker families / vulnerable children and we thank our families for sending in their requirements so that we can assess viability.

If you haven't and still want a place that is absolutely fine and will help! As long as families use the service as much as they have requested all will be well.

Mrs Slater and Mrs Jones will undertake morning duties.

Mrs Slater and Mrs Brinkley will undertake evening duties.

Children will be in their bubbles - this means the hall will be split into thirds.

We are running just 2 price slots, one for the morning and one for the evening as we do not have the staffing capacity to work out all the booking for different times. We have been able to keep these slots cheaper than current provision and we hope that you understand our approach which allows us to offer this service for you.

Dear Families,

We are proud of our children, families and staff who are working so hard and who are being so passionate about their learning. We are having between 180 and 250 pieces of work a day at every hour of the day, early and late, some of which come in at 9.00 pm and, when marking, even at 1 minute a piece that's 3 - 4 hours a day marking. Most pieces take longer as they are wonderful videos or need scrutiny. This is all on top of planning and teaching face to face, supporting emotional needs and, teachers still have to complete assessment recording, communications and other school responsibilities. Under normal circumstances in school we feedback within the lesson and whilst we read every piece of work, we do not comment in every book in every lesson and we create a 'FIT' (Feedback Improvement Time) sheet to list all the next steps needed and, the next piece of learning is tailored to that. Additionally, the DFE (Department For Education) are expecting 3 hours quality learning a day and state that feedback should be weekly as a minimum. We love feeding back but we cannot sustain the current level of engagement on seesaw which ordinarily would have been verbal in class and within adjusted tasks set.

Feedback from families is that many parents and children are on their knees already and teachers, as much as they want to mark every piece with in-depth comments, this is not sustainable so, in order to manage everyone's mental health we need to review the amount of work expected to help children and families and, target what needs marking with a 'like' on everything else then, teachers can plan next steps based on how the children have achieved.

English and maths will be liked or if teachers are happy and it's accurate and quality marked (e.g. circled in red, comments, voice notes etc.). if there are any corrections, improvements needed. All other work will be appreciated and approved with comments only if the children are off course.

Additionally, the timescales for staff to respond to work and communications will be between the hours of 8.30 am – 4.00pm unless they choose to do so but it is not an expectation and work after this time will be liked or added to journal after 4pm unless the children have gone really wrong and feedback will be provided.

We are deploying all available staff to feedback on seesaw.

IMPORTANT - NEEDS ACTION

CLASS DOJO

We are thrilled with how class dojo works for us and, we notified you within our privacy notice that this was a business tool we used and which you knew about in signing up for an account. All GDPR compliance statements from the companies we use listed in our privacy notice are collected and collated. However, I need to do 2 things -

1. Inform you that we are entering into a Standard Contractual Clauses (SCC) with Class Dojo to further assist with meeting the GDPR legal requirements regarding personal data to ensure that appropriate security is applied to data being transferred or stored outside of the EEA, in compliance with European Commission and European Data Protection Board guidance.

2. To request specific permission from you to continue with your account on class dojo (normally it would be to set up an account but that ship has sailed!) due to the information provided.

TEXT SCAM - PLEASE DON'T GET CAUGHT OUT

Due to the roll out the new vaccine, many people are anticipating contact from health care professionals about the opportunity and turn to receive their dose. This is great news, but unfortunately, criminals are seeing this as an opportunity to lure people into clicking links on fraudulent text messages and emails, with the eager anticipation of vaccine news and cyber criminality, this could lead to a perfect storm if people aren't aware.

Using X Box or Play Station to access HWB

Accessing your remote learning. An alternative method of accessing remote learning during times of lockdown.


X Box

1. Plug a key board in to the X box USB slot
2. Go in to my games and apps
3. Find Microsoft Edge and select
4. Type in: HWB and log in as you would in school
5. You can then access your work through one drive and use key packages including:
 - Word
 - Teams
 - Excel
 - PowerPoint
 - Your emails
6. To move around you use the X Box control or plug a mouse



Play Station

1. Identify the Play Station internet browser icon (it is WWW with dots around it)
2. Press the PS4 logo on the controller
3. Go to the library and find options for games and applications
4. Go in to applications and you will find the internet browser
5. Type HWB into the browser and log in as you would in school
6. You can then access your work through one drive and use key packages including:
 - Word
 - Teams
 - Excel
 - PowerPoint
 - Your emails



