NSPCC ROCKS

On Friday 7th May, as part of National Number Day, we will be taking part in NSPCC Rocks, TT Rockstars' first UK-wide online times tables competition. For each school taking part TT Rockstars will donate to the NSPCC and we will also do some mathematical fundraising ourselves to mark and celebrate National Number Day and support the NSPCC. We are



asking children to bring in donations of any type of British sterling coins which we will place side by side in a huge chain on the playground! As part of their maths that day the children will complete activities around the coins. They might estimate the number of coins or the total value of the coins and calculate them or estimate the distance created by the chain of coins. They might reason whether the chain would be longer/shorter if we used more 5ps or 10ps and many other activities.

Please could donations be brought in on Friday 7th May and we will of course let you know how much we raised and the length of our chain - keep an eye on our twitter feed!
