To date, from a personal perspective, this is one of the most difficult messages I have written to our children and families.

In the summer of this year, after having the privilege of working as a Headteacher for just over 14 years, 8 of which in the Forest Family/Federation and, over 2 years in JTMAT, I shall be leaving.

On one hand I feel like my heart is being torn out and I am leaving my family behind but, I am excited about the path I am to take as I have secured the post of CEO (Chief Education Officer) in TSSMAT (The Staffordshire Schools Multi Academy Trust) which currently has 4, small, rural schools and, intends to grow, which will form part of my role.

I can honestly say that, despite some significant challenges, not a day has gone by that I haven't wanted to come to work, to go to school and see our fantastic staff - my wonderful colleagues, to speak to our engaged, lovely parents and most of all, to learn, play and work with our amazing children.

I have learned a huge amount about myself as a person and a leader during my time here and I am grateful for how I have grown and am proud of the part I have played, within a great team, in making The Forest Family the thriving collaboration that it is today. My dream to lead small, rural schools and be an integral part of their communities has been beautifully realised.

I have had the honour of working with inspiring leaders, dedicated and passionate teachers, hardworking and enthused support staff, kind and impacting volunteers, supportive and engaged families, loving and involved clergy, interested and helpful community and, of course, our inspiring, funny, and beautiful children who teach me something new every day. My years at each stage of The Forest Family's growth have been wonderful and have given me the privilege and the pleasure of seeing hundreds of children develop and flourish as confident, successful young people, many staff to nurture and grow including two TAs to teachers and 2 Deputies into Headship. And, it will be with sadness and lifelong fond memories that I will leave The Forest Family; two happy and vibrant, successful schools attributed to the dedication and the passion of all of our staff at all levels and the exemplary behaviour and attitudes of our children.

In order to prevent any anxiety about the future of the leadership of our family, recruitment is underway for a new, excellent Executive Headteacher across The Forest Family and, in the interim our highly capable Deputy, Mrs J. Jones will be acting Executive Headteacher with the consistent and excellent Deputy Headteacher support of Mrs D. Preston at Needwood and, a new post of acting Deputy from within our teaching body at All Saints. Our Governing Body and JTMAT are responsible for appointing my successor and they will ensure they appoint the right person, someone who is fantastic to lead our schools into the next phase of their journey. Additionally, they are fortunate in having a strong academy trust, effective Governing Body, and leadership team as well as all the brilliant and committed staff who are passionate about improving the education and well-being of our children each day.

Thank you for your support so that I can take the next steps into my future.
