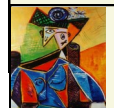

THIS WEEK IN FOCUS

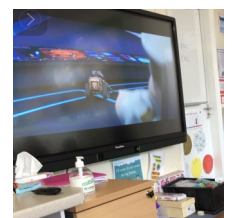
