PARKING AND ROAD SAFETY



The speedwatch team has been very active recently, particularly <u>Monday to Friday</u> 8.30-10am. They report to the police any vehicle logged as travelling over 35mph – which is a really high speed given the "20 is Plenty outside our School" campaign.

Quite a lot of cars with children have been reported and have received letters from the Police and the team hope to ramp up the operations and have a number of volunteers waiting to be trained.

We know that all our staff and families take the safety of our children and the public seriously and, remind everyone of their responsibility to drive and park safely. Thank you.

For a very long time now the Parish Council has been working with Staffordshire County Council Highways on further safety improvements to reduce traffic speeds and improve the safety of pedestrians and vehicles alike. Final plans have been drawn up and SCC will shortly be consulting with those affected, including the school. These include yellow lines around the corners of Yoxall Road and the B5234, both outside the church and the pub. This will mean a significant reduction in parking availability for vehicles dropping off/picking up school children in the interests of the safety of all. When we have details as to how to engage in this consultation.
