# EUROS 2021 – Football shirt Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June

We are excited to let you know about our planned events for the first week back in the run up to the 'kick off' of the Euros on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2021.

Our Forest Family schools have had a long relationship with St George's Park since its initial development and opening. We were proud to take children and staff to the original ground-breaking celebration, took part in opening events and have used the site since: providing teams for football coaches to learn and develop their skills; providing ball girls and boys for international fixtures for teams of all age groups and meeting some highly regarded players, coaches and managers along the way. Although this has been disrupted by COVID, the impact of having such a prestigious site nearby means that football is often in the minds of our pupils (and staff) with some of them using facilities out of school and all showing an interest in our international team.

The postponed Euro 2020 tournament provides the next opportunity for us to use football – and all the positives it encompasses – to enhance our curriculum delivery within school.

Our launch worship is planned for our return to school after the Whit half term, on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June, with learning over the week to build up to our 'Football Shirt Friday Event' to tie in with the opening fixtures which take place on Friday June 11<sup>th</sup>.

Activities all week will be linked to a variety of subjects, such as Geography, English and Maths and children will randomly select countries in the tournament to study in the launch week and to follow throughout the tournament. Children will be involved in finding out about the teams involved in the tournament, the locations of the matches and a range of learning linked to this from researching flags and national anthems, to finding out about kits (colours, materials and technology), learning about the mascots and designing for them, studying statistics and using them in our maths and of course playing football ourselves too - it will be a busy week.



We have been in contact with Good Morning Britain and hope to be interviewed by them as schools closest to St George's park and, we will wear Football shirts on the Friday!

# **SCHOOL TRIPS**

## WHITSUN

Whitsun week is next week so what is it all about?



Whitsun, also known as Pentecost, celebrates the Christian festival of Pentecost which occurs 50 days after Easter. It marks the date that the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples of Jesus after his ascension from earth to heaven on Ascension Day. Whitsun, is also known, Whitsunday or Whit Sunday in different places throughout the world. Whitsun is closely followed by Whit Monday which is considered the second day of the Pentecost festival and is a public holiday in many countries with Christian traditions.

Why is it called Whitsun? The name of this religious holiday most likely originates from the term 'White Sunday' as it is believed to be a specific day for Christian baptisms which are ceremonies where people traditionally wear white as a symbol of their new birth into a life of grace.

I am writing to you to share some information from our partners in the local area.


Following the national school closures in response to the Covid 19 pandemic and the subsequent return to school over the last few months. Colleagues in our partner services have seen a rise in reports of online bullying and incidents occurring over social media.

Through PSHE lessons, form tutor time and assemblies, we will endeavor to discuss these issues with students and raise their awareness to the concerns and dangers of social media use.

However, we also ask that as parents/carers you are aware of these issues, the age restrictions on certain social media and apps and are alert to what your children are engaging in online.

# **CHURCH/COMMUNITY**

### Activities

There will be a service of **holy communion** starting at **11:15am on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> June**. We are delighted that Rev Richard Tebbs will take the service. Richard is a recently retired vicar from the west of Birmingham who has volunteered to help out.

There will be a meeting of the **Tatenhill and Rangemore Parish Council** in the space created in the church aisle on **Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> June at 7:30pm**.

The **Gardening Club** will hold a plant swap in the church on **Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> June starting at 7:00pm**. This is a local gardening night, where all are welcome. No green fingers or experience needed. Bring along any plants/seeds that you might have spare or extra from your garden, and swop for other plants or varieties with other locals. There will be sharing of allotment/garden advice and tips, so bring along any questions for our experts. Planning a 'plant along' session on the night, giving everyone the opportunity to get your hands dirty. All social distancing followed. (Please bring cash - refreshments will be available)

The **churchyard brigade** will have an inaugural meeting on **Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> June at 10:00am**. We are looking to form a volunteer group to clear the Churchyard and then keep it in good order. In my time the churchyard has gone from an untended hayfield to an area that has been strimmed two or three times per year. We aim to take the standard that achieved by Newborough and Hanbury. We have recently acquired a mower in order to keep the churchyard looking nice. The issue is that there are numerous ornate graves that are overgrown with stone just below the surface that could damage/wreck the mower. The plan is to incorporate a wild flower section in the area where there are unmarked graves (mounds) from the 1800s. The plan is to clear the graves, one grave at a time. Please bring gardening equipment with you including spades, hedge trimmers, saws, powered mowers, powered strimmers etc. We have an old but serviceable wheel barrow. This will allow us to gradually make mowing of the churchyard easier and make the churchyard properly presentable for those tending their relative's graves and paying respect, in line with the diocese rules on churchyards. The **cleaning brigade** will meet on 1<sup>st</sup> June at 10:00am

The PCC has recently received a temporary faculty (church planning permission) to clear most of the pews from the aisle. This has created a magnificent space which is available for activities by the local community. At this stage, we wish to prove the demand for use of this space such that we can justify a permanent arrangement whereby the parish of Rangemore has a village hall. There will not be a charge for use this year, but donations would be most welcome.

There are plans for a Messy Church activity (toddler group) on Wednesday mornings. If you are interested, please let the church warden (John Fawn) know (<u>rangemore@btconnect.com</u>).

We are looking to replace the magnificent church oak gates as they have deteriorated to the stage where they are looking very sad. The white plaster work inside the church has been repainted and the church looks much better for it. Over the winter the lights in the church were upgraded and energy efficient LED bulbs that are much brighter have been installed.

The Friends of Rangemore Church are exploring how to get the clock and its chimes reactivated. This initiative was spearheaded by Geoff Higgins before his untimely death, but his son, Ed Higgins, is continuing the work. Over the summer, the trees at the school end of churchyard will be severely pruned, and the yew trees in the churchyard will be pruned and shaped.

Our plans are to return to the services every week status that existed before covid lockdown. The services in the past have been comparatively low church holy communion services. If anyone has ideas for other services (such as childrens services), please let the church warden (John Fawn) know (<u>rangemore@btconnect.com</u>).

I would like to remind you that our magnificent church setting is available for christenings, marriages and funerals.
