

All Saints PTA 50/50 Club

Your chance to win a monthly cash prize! –

'You have to be in it to win it'

What is the 50/50 Club? - The 50/50 club is a monthly prize draw run by the PTA where 50% of cash generated makes up the monthly prizes and 50% goes to the PTA towards essential and fun resources for your children and the school.

How does it work? – Each member pays £10 for 10 draws from October to July, equivalent to £1.00 per month, giving you the chance to win cash in our monthly prize draw. There is no limit to the amount of entries you can have so if you wish you could buy as gifts for family members.

Who can enter? – Membership is open to all parents, carers, staff, family and friends. Anyone 16 years and over can join.

How do I pay? – You can pay on ParentPay, in multiples of £10 depending on how many chances you want in the draw.

When will the draw take place? – The draw will take place at the end of each month and you will be notified by the school if you are lucky. It will also be put on the 1^{st} newsletter of the next month.

What could I win? - 1st Prize = 40%, 2nd Prize = 5%, 3nd Prize = 5% The amount that you could win depends on how many draws are sold. The more who enter the greater the monthly prize!
