#### **IT'S GOOD TO GROW SCHEME**

The PTA have supported the school tremendously over the last few years and provided funds for essentials and extras in school that have benefitted all children. It is therefore worrying for school that the current committee, who have worked so hard over recent years, were only joined by one other parent at the meeting. It had been the intention for a number of the committee to step down last night, but in order to support school and ensure the children don't miss out on key opportunities this term, they have agreed to

continue until Christmas for which school is very grateful.

The PTA and school are extremely grateful to those people who have spoken to members of the PTA committee recently and offered to provide help with events/activities, but without a committee we shall simply lose these things. I'm sure you will all agree that this would be deeply saddening. One example of what the PTA provide is the coach costs for the pantomine trip each year and without this we believe that the cost would potentially be unaffordable to school and families.
