

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 (AS AMENDED) ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991

> TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION NOTICE Various Street East Staffordshire

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Staffordshire County Council being the highway authority responsible for the repair and maintenance of Various Street in Staffordshire are satisfied that it is necessary to close the length of Streetway Road (Shenstone) Mill Lane (Shenstone) Armitage Hill (Dunstall) Moores Hill (Tatenhill) Bow Meadow Lane (Newborough) Glass Lane (Abbots Bromley) Thorney Lane (Hoar Cross) Hollow Lane (Colton) Blithbury Road (Rugeley) Blithbury Road (Hamstall Ridware) for a period of 5 days but no more than 5 days from 11th October 2021 because of the likelihood of danger to the public during mobile carriageway repairs being undertaken by Staffordshire County Council.

Access will be available for pedestrians and for vehicles being used in connection with the works and for emergency services vehicles or for vehicles requiring access to premises on the length of road which is closed.
