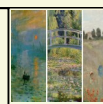

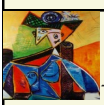

Another great week of learning this week!

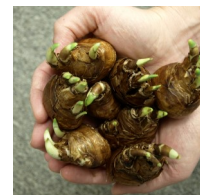

Well done everyone. 😊

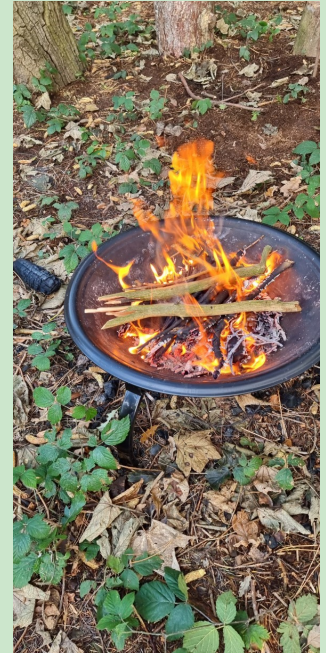
They learnt the safety rules of using a sheath knife and most of the children happily toasted their marshmallows using a long stick they had found that had been sharpened.
