Have a super, safe half term holiday everyone- remember Monday 1st is an inset day.





The Benefice of Hanbury, Newborough, Rangemore will hold its remembrance service on the 14th November at Rangemore. Service will begin at 10:45am so that the one-minute silence can start at 11:00 am



The British Legion Colours will be paraded in the church and afterwards at the war memorial. Observers at the war memorial commemoration will get the best view from the road footpath by the perimeter wall. The service will not include holy communion. The names of all of the Benefice Fallen will be read out. The collection plate will be donated to the British Legion, as is the normal custom

After the formalities have been completed, refreshments will be available in the aisle. A voluntary donation would be appreciated to cover the costs.
