Dear Parents and Carers,

READING DIARIES

This school year we have introduced a different reading diary for all of the children. We would like the children to read to you at home at least 5 times a week. The children should aim to read for about 10 minutes if they can (this will depend on age of course). Those children that read regularly at home find accessing the rest of the curriculum more straightforward and make better progress. When you listen to your child read please make a comment and sign the diary. If your child is independently reading, they can complete their diary but we ask that a parent signs to see that they have read. Thank you for your support!

CLASS DOJO

Expectations:

- Whilst it is convenient that we can communicate with Dojo, please be mindful of the relevance and frequency of communication. It is still better to speak to a member of staff in person or on the telephone if you are able to do so.

- Please carefully consider if the method of communication is most appropriate in the situation and to remember that staff have a right to be treated with respect, and any concerns or complaints are expected to be approached in a calm and appropriate manner. Messages written in anger or frustration, containing threatening or offensive language will not be responded to and a meeting will be convened.

- Also, please consider the timing of any Dojo messages. The staff have families and lives outside of school so do not expect a reply after 'normal' working hours.

- If a member of staff believes that a topic is too sensitive for a written reply, an appointment will be made for a face-to-face discussion.

- Please send only non-vital messages via email and Dojo. Absence, appointments, alterations in collections and medications etc must be communicated via the school office, by telephone or in person please.

- Please remember that confidential information should be conveyed by phone or personal contact.
