

The children were lucky enough to be invited up to the Deer Park to get an idea of how a working dairy farm is run. Paddy Prince was very informative and patient with the children and did a fabulous tour. Very unusually, there were a number of new born lambs to see. It is very early to see this as most of their flock, are not due yet. They have around 250 sheep. A lot of excitement was felt by the children as they were each allowed to hold a new born lamb if they wished to. As they were in so close proximity to the animals the children behaved impeccably by keeping their voices low.



They were then taken to see some week old and a two day old calf. Some of the children let the calf suck their fingers and were very surprised how strong he was.... and very slobbery! They passed the bull who was chilling out in the barn and were surprised to be told he weighed about a ton.

We all then went into the milking parlour and were shown how the cows feed whilst they were being milked. The farm has around 90 cows and their milk is collected daily. The tank can store around 3.500 litres which would be approximately two days' worth, although as mentioned it is usually only half full as the tanker collects every morning. The Prince's milk supplies Muller and Tesco.

We finished looking at the silage that is stored for the cows to eat during the winter months and into the large building that house the cows during the winter. They learnt that a cow drinks around 50 litres of water daily, which helps produce the milk....but lots of wee too. This area it cleaned three times daily. A very busy lifestyle for the farmer that starts early 365 days a year.

Thank you to all the parents that took and collected their children which enabled this event to go ahead.

ONLINE SAFETY

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

YouTube Kids is a child-friendly version of YouTube which offers a colourful and easy-to-navigate environment that's suitable for young children. This app is easily accessible and available for mobile devices, which can be downloaded without needing the YouTube app on the device. Despite YouTube Kids seeming like a very child-friendly platform, it has raised concerns over its advertising and inappropriate content seeping through the curation process.

SETTING

Download the YouTube Kids app and connect your own YouTube channel.

Input your child's name, age and birth month. OSCAR

3 Select the types of videos you want to include for your child based on their age and your own personal choice.

If you decide to approve the content yourself, the app will present you with sample videos for you to accept and reject.

Once you've made your choice, you're ready to use the app!











Advice for Parents & Carers

REMOVE ADVERTISEMENTS

Like YouTube, adverts on YouTube Kids are also quite pervasive. If you decide you don't want your child being exposed to adverts, you can subscribe to YouTube Premium which will remove adverts on YouTube Kids. However, it's worth remembering that this doesn't block adverts that content creators decide to make as part of their content, and children are still able to access channels from branded fast food or toy companies.

RESTRICT VIEWING TIME

BE WARY OF UNSUITABLE CONTENT

YouTube Kids has a far lower chance of showing unsuitable material than YouTube, but there are still reports of malicious users deliberately uploading inappropriate content. It's important that your child feels able to talk to you if they were ever exposed to upsetting content in the future. It's also safest to report inappropriate videos: tap the three dots in the corner of the video and select 'Report'.

MONITOR WATCH HISTORY

YouTube Kids has also made it possible for parents and carers to see what their children are watching on the app by clicking on the "Recommended" icon on the top right of the home screen. It may also be worth having a look at what your child has recently watched by clicking on their history tab. The red bar on the video shows how much of the video has been watched.


