est School meant fun building a den. The children got into two groups and set to. It was great to see the foreman, site inspector and labourer 'or something along those lines' that the children became.

It is fascinating to see how the children act when left to make their own decisions. We discussed this afterwards and a couple spoke about wanting to do more or have more of a say in the decision making. Others were more than happy to be told what to do.... or even to do nothing!. We chatted about those that wanted more responsibility and whether or not they had made this known, often as not they hadn't and this lead to a good discussion about natural leaders and building confidence to put their own thoughts and opinions across when working as a team.

Both dens were fabulous and very different but crucially passed the water test of having water poured over it whilst the children were inside.

We finished with guessing how old a bird lives to in the wild compared to being monitored when in captivity. Who would have thought that the average age of a Blackbird is 3 but the oldest recorded is 47 years, or that a Woodpigeon again 3 years against 44 in captivity. The children contributed fully with their views on why this should be.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

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Occurring through messaging apps, on social media and in online games, group chats are among the most popular ways that young people engage with their peers online. Involving, by definition, three or more individuals, these groups allow users to send messages, images and videos to everyone in one place. While they are useful for helping friends, people with shared interests or members of a club to communicate and coordinate activities, they can

also leave young people feeling excluded and bullied - as well as providing

opportunities for inappropriate content to be shared and viewed.

Advice for Parents & Carers

GIVE SUPPORT, NOT JUDGEMENT

BLOCK, REPORT AND LEAVE

If your child is in a chat where inappropriate content is being shared, advise them to block the users sending the material, report them to the host app or platform and exit the group. If any of this content could be putting a minor at risk, contact the police. Emphosise to your child that it's OK for them to simply leave any group chat that they don't feel comfortable being a part of.

Group chats are often an arena for young people to gain social status. This could cause them to do or say things on impulse, which could upset others in the group. Encourage your child to consider how other people might feel if they engaged in this behaviour. If your child does upset a member of their group chat, support them to reach out, show empathy and apologise for their mistake.

CONSIDER OTHERS' FEELINGS

In any online communication, it's vital for young people to be aware of what they're sharing and who might potentially see it. Discuss the importance of not revealing identifiable details like their address, their school or photos that they wouldn't like to be seen widely. Remind them that once something is shared in a group, they lose control of where it may end up and how it might be used.

Remind your child that they can confide in you if they feel bullied or excluded in a group chat, instead of responding to the person who's upset them. Validate their hurt feelings and help to put them back in control by discussing how they'd like to handle the situation. On a related note, you could also empower your child to speak up if they're in a chat where others are being picked on. AVOID INVITING STRANGERS

SILENCE NOTIFICATIONS

Having a phone or tablet bombarded with notifications from a group chat can be a massive irritation and distraction – especially if it's happening late in the evening. Explain to your child that they can still be part of the group chat, but that it would be healthier for them to turn off or mute the notifications and catch up with the conversation at a time which better suits them.


