What a lovely way to finish our Forest School sessions. The children all met at the Deer Park and were so lucky. Because of the amount of rain we have been having, there were lots of lambs still inside as the ground was still so wet. They were able to see them with their mothers and learnt that usually a sheep has two lambs. If one has triplets the farmer has to try and find a mother that has perhaps only had one lamb, or one has died. They have to work very quickly and make sure that any of the juices from her own lamb are rubbed onto the 'adopted' lamb in order that she does not reject it and allows it to suckle from her.

Then then went into the milking parlour and learnt so many fascinating facts about milking and the cows themselves. They learnt that a cow usually has around 14 calves in a lifetime. Usually, one a year. They are

pregnant for 9 months. They are milked for around 305 days a year and then have a 2 month rest. They drink a LOT of water, around 40 to 50 litres a day.

They went into the milking parlour and was shown the large refrigerator unit that stores the milk. It holds around 7000 litres and is emptied daily. It rapidly brings the milk down from around 38 c, the cow's body temperature, which is virtually the same as a human, to 26c. Paddy spoke about how healthy milk is for you, particularly for growing children and contrary to popular belief it is very healthy with full fat milk only containing around 4% fat.

The children were told all about how all cows in this country have a tracking system, where they wear a tag from birth until their death so there is full traceability.

They finished the session with them each holding a baby lamb, which was only a day or so old.

We are so appreciative to Paddy Prince for all her time and generosity, providing a drink and biscuit to each child.


